HOW THE POLL WAS CONDUCTED

This poll was conducted by Mason-Dixon Polling & Strategy, Inc. of Jacksonville, Florida from July 24 through July 27, 2019. A total of 500 likely Republican primary voters in Mississippi voters were interviewed statewide by telephone.

Those interviewed were randomly selected from a phone-matched Mississippi voter registration list that included both land-line and cell phone numbers. Quotas were assigned to reflect Republican primary voter turnout by county.

The margin for error, according to standards customarily used by statisticians, is no more than \pm 4.5 percentage points. This means that there is a 95 percent probability that the "true" figure would fall within that range if all voters were surveyed.

QUESTION: Medicaid provides government-subsidized insurance to low-income mothers, children, the disabled and other populations. Under Obamacare, some states have expanded eligibility for Medicaid to able-bodied, working-age adults with no children. Would you be more likely or less likely to support a candidate who voted for Medicaid expansion?
