The Mississippi Center for Public Policy has real impact shaping the policy debate in our state. Over the past year, we have accomplished the following:










#### SPEAKERS SERIES

Our weekly newsletter has 84,000 subscribers, and with a consistent 21 percent open rate, we have one of the largest readerships of any media outlet across the state.




#### THOUGHT LEADERSHIP

MJI is fighting to strike down a state-wide moratorium that has banned certain health care facilities opening in our state for the past 43 years.

As momentum grows for education freedom, MJI has also been laying the ground work by showing that school choice is constitutional. MJI has also been defending pro-life physicians from possible sanctions for acting according to their conscience.


## MISSISSIPPI LEADERSHIP ACADEMY: THE ANTIDOTE TO "WOKE"!
