## A MESSAGE FROM OUR CHAIRMAN

For the past 15 years, America has endured a relentless ideological assault—a revolution masquerading as progress. Men, we were told, could become women and take part in women's sports. Transgender admirals, they said, were needed in the Navy.

It didn't stop at biology. Our nation's history was rewritten—1776 discarded for 1619, and statues toppled by neo-Marxist mobs. Movies and books were

produced not to entertain but to lecture and scold.

The radical left didn't merely politicize culture or weaponize sport. They aimed to gut the Constitution itself—stacking the Supreme Court, scrapping the electoral college, and elevating D.C. to statehood.

Then just like that, millions of Americans said, "Enough." Revolution, as Victor Hanson Davis has said, seems to be giving way to what he calls America's Restoration.

For the first time in years, the federal government is run by people ready to push back. D.E.I. schemes are being dismantled, immigration laws enforced, and cultural Marxists told that their dogma no longer holds sway.

But it's not enough to leave it to Washington, D.C., to undo the damage of the past couple of decades and restore our country. That's why MCPP spearheads efforts to point our representatives towards policies that will best serve Mississippi.

Instead of being the last to implement conservative policies, Mississippi could be a leader. Wouldn't it be nice if we took the lead?


Over the past couple of years, our advocacy has been effective as Mississippi's policymakers have embraced several of our flagship policy recommendations, driving transformative change across the state. These wins include:

- **Income Tax Cut** to a flat 4 percent, putting more money back into the pockets of Mississippians.
- Labor Market Freedom with a groundbreaking universal occupational licensing law that dismantles barriers and unleashes opportunity.
- Education Reform with a new funding model to fund students, not systems, providing each child with a personalized education budget tailored to their needs.
- **Combating Critical Race Theory** with legislation to counter divisive ideologies, prohibiting colleges from teaching that any group of Americans is inherently superior or inferior based on race or other traits.

These reforms are delivering tangible results. For generations, Mississippi languished at the bottom of national rankings—50th out of 50 states. Now, the tide is turning. Evidence of progress is clear: according to the U.S. Bureau of Economic Analysis, Mississippi emerged as one of the fastest-growing states in the nation in 2024. Our strategic vision is lifting the state from its historic lows, charting a course toward prosperity and opportunity for all.

### MOVING THE POLICY DEBATE

MCPP now has one of the largest digital audiences of any conservative organization in the state.

It is not enough to have the right principles and right policy solutions. Nor is it enough to engage with policy makers at the Capitol. The digital media revolution means that to be effective, we need to reach hundreds of thousands across Mississippi and beyond.

Over the past year, we have seen explosive growth.

#### STUDIO

Thanks to a generous local donor, MCPP was given a grant to build a simple studio. We now produce a weekly podcast and video in-house, watched by thousands across the state.

#### SOCIAL MEDIA EXPLOSION

MCPP's staff social media accounts have grown rapidly. We now have combined over 90,000 followers on X (formerly Twitter), 11,000 YouTube subscribers, and 2,526 on Instagram.

#### PODCASTING

We don't just produce our own podcast. MCPP's CEO, Douglas Carswell, has appeared on others, including Patrick Bet-David's podcast, watched by over 197,000 across America.
